### HEBREW WORD PICTURES

Revealing Prophetic Truths. By Dr. Frank T. Seekins

Every Hebrew letter is both a sound and a picture. Here are three interesting examples:

By taking the Hebrew letter ע Ayin, which means an eye, ( $\circlearrowleft$  in ancient Hebrew) and adding it to דרית ( $\tau$  ברית) breet, or covenant, the word עברית, ivreet, ( $\tau$  בין פביע) - Hebrew, is formed. This word picture tells us that the Hebrew language reveals the covenant.

The letter Alef,  $\aleph$  which means an ox, (& in ancient Hebrew) symbolizes: first, or strong. The letter Chet,  $\sqcap$  is the picture of a fence. Together, they spell the Hebrew word  $\sqcap \aleph$  ( $\exists \&$ ), brother. The Hebrew word picture tells us that brothers and sisters are the *strong fence*, or the *protectors* in life.
